Dear Sahuaro Students and Families,

We hope everyone is having a great summer! We are now entering our third full school year of in-person learning. Our students have shown that they are successfully recovering from the impact of remote learning, building connections with our school's community, and growing as young adults. Excitingly, we are now ready to take our expectations for conduct, learning, and performance to the next level. To facilitate this, we are preparing to create a variety of opportunities for our students to cultivate mindful behavior, hone their learning skills, and excel on Advanced Placement, PSAT, Aspire, CTE, AIMS Science, and the ACT exams in the spring testing season. In this letter, you will find important information to help you to prepare for a successful start to the school year, and remember school starts on Thursday, August 3.

Kick-Off Events

This year, to prepare for the school year, we are offering two kick-off sessions for our returning families. At these sessions, parents and students can apply for the Federal Free or Reduced Meal Plan, purchase a PE uniform or Cougar swag, receive a PE lock if enrolled in a PE class (PE students will only be allowed to use school issued locks starting this year), complete online ATS forms for sports, visit student club booths, purchase a yearbook (see more information about our layaway opportunity this summer), and more. To make it easier on families, we will not be assigning dates and times based on class and student's last name. Instead, parents and students can select the day and time that works best for them. However, please note that the busiest times for these sessions will be 8:00-10:00 am and 4:00-6:00 pm, so plan accordingly.

New Policies

Here is a quick overview of new policies that we will be enforcing this year.

Tardy Policy: Excessive tardies can be very disruptive and can have a negative impact on students' learning. If a student is tardy more than twice in a given week, they will be assigned lunch detention by their teacher. Any further absences or tardiness in that week may result in further disciplinary action, such as a family conference, a behavior plan, and/or an ISI assignment.

Roaming: In order to maximize the learning opportunities for all students, our expectation is that every student reports to their assigned class at the prescribed times. For obvious reasons, we simply cannot allow students to be on campus without going to class. After five minutes into each class period, all students seen in the hall without a pass will be directed to the PIC Room by security or other school employees. Students will be assigned immediate interventions by the teacher in the room and will be required to remain in the room for the rest of the period. On the second violation, the student will receive a further intervention assignment and will remain in the room for the remainder of the school day. Any



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repeat violations will result in further escalation of action, including but not limited to family conferences, behavior plans, and an ISI assignment. Furthermore, students will have access to online coursework to stay on track with classroom learning.

NC for Excessive Absences: Successful completion of in class assignments, taking notes, classroom discussions, and regular attendance are all critical factors for a student's learning. Students who record 10 or more unexcused absences in a semester for a class will be issued an "NC" (No Credit). Students and families may submit an "Attendance Appeal," requesting for student's potential passing grade to be restored. At the end of each semester, a school committee will review the Attendance Appeals. The committee may grant the credit, deny the credit, or grant the credit on the condition of the student successfully completing an attendance contract. This policy only applies to the courses the student is receiving a passing grade. This policy does not apply to the classes where the student earned an F.

Again, these policies are designed to elevate our student expectation next year. We will discuss these policies in more detail in our family Zoom meeting in July. Expect more details on cell phones and academic integrity soon as well.

^{*}Unless it is determined to be needed by the administration due to an event of an exceptional hardship. Failure or the need to avoid an undesirable grade is not considered an exceptional hardship.

Students need 23 credits to graduate. Students are required to take 6 classes each semester. Any deviation requires approval of the principal; questions may be directed to the Assistant Principal of Curriculum and Instruction. Students earn 6 credits each year, ½ credits are posted each semester. Only semester grades are official and count toward graduation requirements. Grade reports are issued every 4½ weeks and include grades, attendance, and teacher comments. Graduation requirements established by the State of Arizona are as follows:

Hello Cougar Families:

The Health Office is here to help your student be healthy and remain in school. Please contact the Health Office if your student has one or more of the following:

- A severe allergy that must be treated with an Epi-Pen
- A chronic medical condition that may affect attendance as the Chronic Medical Certification form must be renewed with a physician's signature every year
- Must take prescribed medication during school hours
 - A permission form signed by the parent/guardian is required
 - The medication must be in the original container with the pharmacy label
- Has a special diet prescribed by a doctor
- Any significant medical or mental health condition that is important for the nurse to know to best care for your student at school.

All medical information is kept with strict confidence according to HIPAA and FERPA guidelines.

Please update the Health Office if your phone number changes during the year. We rely on the information on the emergency contact information to reach parents/guardians when your student is sick or injured.

Students should not carry any medications at school, except for an Epi-Pen or asthma inhaler.

The Health Office DOES NOT SUPPLY, allergy, cold, or cough medications (including cough drops).

If your student becomes sick at school and needs to go home, the student must come to the Health Office to be evaluated by the nurse or health assistant. If you student needs or wants to go home we will contact you.

Encourage your student to eat breakfast or bring something to eat that is easily carried in their backpack and eaten between classes such as fruit, granola bars, string cheese, dry cereal, etc. This will help your student to avoid headaches and fatigue caused by the lack of food in the morning. Water bottles are encouraged as well, as we do not supply water bottles. Maintaining proper hydration will also prevent headache and fatigue during the school day.

If you have any questions or concerns, contact the Health Office at the number below. I will be available in the Health Office from 7:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Monday Aug. 1^{st} and Wednesday Aug 3^{rd} . During the school year I am available daily from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Once school starts the Health Office hours are 8:00 a.m. to 3:15 p.m.


