### A. Principal Report

Parent Square: Mr. Estrella is not sure what the parents see regarding the app, but he is pleased with the administrator side. It is user-friendly, and information is being disseminated to families quickly and efficiently.



Class Intercom: A new app that is like other social media app. Mr. Estrella wants to encourage Coaches, club sponsors, and music directors to use Class Intercom. It is another platform to send out even more information regarding events and celebrations

Digital Hall Pass- With the implementation of digital hall passes there have been and continue to be adjustments. It has been found that a student ID is not as critical since students' pictures populate in the app. Overall, teachers are finding it to be a positive tool. We are seeing fewer students in the hallways, and the 3-pass limit has been successful. We are in constant contact with the district to make refinements as needed.

B. ACT Scores-Not where we want to be, but we are seeing a growth trend. The 2024-25 Math scores made the biggest jump in the district.
